


STAYING ON TRACK APRIL



TIME TO SPRING INTO **SPSA!!**

LCAP development is in progress! It is time to also look at School Site Plans (SPSA) and start to **Align** them with your LCAP Goals! 2017-2018 will need to have this done to meet the new ESSA requirements which will allow them to serve as the District's new LEA PLAN.

California submitted a waiver to have these two plans meet (Replace) the Federal requirement for the "old" LEA Plan which Districts presented to the State Board of Education in 2003.

Many of the school districts are using their School Site Councils (SSC) and District Advisory Committees (DAC) to meet the LCAP requirement for Parent and Community involvement and input into the LCAP development.

THE Goals of the SSC Plan should be aligned with the Goals in the LCAP! Many of you are a one school district and this should be very easy to do. It would also be a good time to have the School Site Plan approved by the School Board, since the Goals are to be aligned.

This would meet the requirement that the SPSA plan has School Board approval, so that funds and activities can continue uninterrupted from one school year until the next.

Additionally, all parties would have an opportunity for input and the District's direction would be clear and all funding would be identified for greater transparency!

Suggested STEPS:

- Review the LCAP with site administration
- Review Goals in LCAP
- Review Goals in LCAP with SSC/DAC
- Discuss Goals that would be appropriate in School Plan
- Remember to include all subgroups,(EL, Low Income, Homeless, Foster Youth)
- Site Goals should align with LCAP Goals
- SPSA could go to School Board for approval at June Board meeting
- SPSA would then be approved for 2017-2018 school year, by July 1, 2017
- Federal funds to include would be all Title I, II ,III VI(REAP), any grants, etc.
- **Federal funds are supplemental to State funds!**
