Child Find: Do you know a Child with Special Needs?



WHAT IS CHILD FIND?

The purpose of Child Find is to identify, locate, and evaluate children and youth ages 3 to 21 years of age who are suspected of having or have a diagnosed disability or developmental delay, in order to provide appropriate special education services under the law.

When Should a Child Be Referred to Child Find?

A child should be referred when:

- A health or medical disorder interferes with development and/or learning
- A child seems to have difficulty seeing or hearing
- A child appears to have a social, emotional or behavioral difficulty that affects his/her ability to learn or interact with others
- A child has a diagnosed progressive or degenerative condition that will eventually impair or impede the child's ability to learn
- A child seems to have difficulty understanding directions like others that are his/her age
- A child's speech is not understood by family or friends
- A child has difficulty with reading, writing, math, or other school subjects

What is Special Education?

Special Education is instruction designed to meet the unique learning strengths and needs of the individual student with disabilities from ages 3 to 22 years of age.



Who is Eligible for Services?

A student must be evaluated and identified as a student having a disability to be eligible for special education programs and related services. The degree of the student's impairment must require special education.

The disability categories are:

- Autism
- Hearing Impairment including deafness
- Deaf-Blindness
- Emotionally Disturbed
- Language/Speech Disorder
- Intellectual Disability
- Multiple disabilities
- Orthopedic Impairment
- Other Health Impairment
- Specific Learning Disability
- Traumatic Brain Injury
- Visual Impairment

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
